Dear Families,

The school year is off to a great start! If you have not already done so, I encourage all parents/guardians to log into either Schoology (TK-5) or Edgenuity (6-12) using the access code provided by your homeroom teacher. This will give you insight into how your student(s) are performing. If you need your code to be sent to you, please reach out to your homeroom teacher.

Every Friday, you will be receiving a signature request from DocHub for your student's weekly learning log. The learning log is one way to track attendance for our school and MUST be submitted weekly. Please complete all required fields, and initial on ALL days that your student attended school or participated in educational activities. Please note: you will e-sign the document through DocHub, so there is no need to print anything out.

I do want to mention that we have had some students log in, but not submit work. As a reminder, all students are expected to log in AND submit work daily Monday-Friday. Your student is welcome to log in on the weekends (to catch up or get ahead), but attendance is only marked Monday-Friday.

To prepare for a successful online learning experience, students should:

- Commit to working on your courses daily (M-F)
- Attend live lessons
- Schedule specific times M-F as "school work" time
- Use the Assignment Calendar and Progress Reports as your measure of course completion
- Make frequent contact with your instructor when you need help progressing through your course
- Attend all meetings with your homeroom teacher
